#### D'Var HaRav (The Cantor's Message)

As November arrives so too does the beautiful season of autumn, which always seems to go by so fast. Indeed, we are already well into the month of November and that means that Holiday season has arrived once again for us Jews, and for society at large, as well, here in the good-old USA. It is a very fun and busy time, filled with excitement and anticipation. Thanksgiving, of course, is the first Holiday to arrive and it is the one which we all share in this country.

It brings together families of all religions and peoples. We rejoice in our thankfulness, as we enjoy the company of family and good friends, and delicious foods prepared by devoted chefs in kitchens across all 50 states. Once Thanksgiving concludes we begin to prepare for the Holidays which are of a more religious nature. For us Jews it is the Hanukah, the festival of lights. While for Christians it is Christmas, a celebration which is also associated with lights and decorations. While we bring in light through the fire of our menorahs, they adorn their trees with ornaments of light. The streets are filled with brightly lit designs of the season.

The theme of light is not the only one which these two Holidays share. They are also both associated with gift giving. This may be somewhat of a complicated or even controversial topic. There are those who feel that gift giving is of central importance during these Holidays; that it is even the most important aspect of the occasion. And then there are those who feel that gift-giving is over indulged and not necessary, or even that it may interfere with other themes of the day, becoming an artificially exaggerated point of focus. From our Jewish perspective, there are those who suggest that Hanukah, here in America, has become more oriented towards gift-giving because of the influence of the way that Christmas is observed. There may be some truth to this idea. But I would suggest that the opposite may be true as well. Perhaps it is we Jews, with our Hanukah, who have influenced the Christians into giving so many gifts. Because Hanukah, for many centuries, has been connected with the theme of giving, especially to children.

We all know about Hanukah gelt! Today most Jewish children are given little bags of chocolate coins to eat and enjoy, perhaps in addition to other gifts which they receive. This tradition of distributing chocolate coins has its origins in the older tradition, going back hundreds of years, of giving actual coins to children. They were given money as gifts, so that they could purchase toys, candies, or whatever else might please the heart's desire of a child. Who knows how much money they were actually given? Almost certainly it varied based on the income and generosity level of each family.

When Jews from Europe cam over to this country they brought with them that custom of gift-giving on Hanukah. Perhaps when Christians saw Jewish parents giving monetary gifts to their children, they decided to bestow such treasures upon their children as well.

This is only my theory but, who knows, it might even be true.

Either way, whatever the custom of your family may be, I hope and pray that all of us will have a Holiday season filled with joy, happiness, community togetherness, health, and peace for everyone! May God bless us all during this autumnal season.


