

(The Cantor's Message)

Three Meanings of Teshuva

Dear Friends:

The Holidays are here, and with them, our thoughts turn to a primary theme of repentance, תשובה / teshuva. Prof. David Lambert of University of North Carolina (Chapel Hill) writes on TheTorah.com – a wonderful website for Torah learning – that the meaning of this word evolves throughout our biblical literature.

The main component of the word תשובה / teshuva is שב , which means "turn." Early prophets of the eighth century B.C.E. (Amos, Hosea, Isaiah) spoke of "turning to Hashem (C-d)" as in appealing to Hashem for help, asking for forgiveness and remedy.

The next evolution is in Jeremiah, late 7 th and early 6 th centuries B.C.E., where Israel is referred to as either a faithless wife or a disobedient child. There, we are asked to be more faithful and committed to the relationship with Hashem: to "re-turn" to the bond with Hashem.

The latest step in this teshuva journey involves nothing less than a total transformation of the nation of Israel and her citizens to become people for whom it is natural and enjoyable to do Hashem's will. In Kings, Ezekiel, Jonah and late segments of Jeremiah, "turning away" from a sinful life is encouraged. This is not a correction of one incident, but an assumption of a new identity.

Deuteronomy 30:6 – considered part of a later editorial layer of the book – described this journey to a new dimension of being as a circumcision of the heart:

וּמָׂל ה אֶלֹהֶיְרֶ אֶת־לְבָבְךֶ וְאֶת־לְבַב זַרְעֶךֶ לְאַהַבְּה אֶת־ה אֱלֹהֶיְרֶ בְּכָל־לְבָבְךְ וּבְכָל־נַפְשְׁךֶ לְמַעַן חַיֵּיְרָ:-

Then your God will [open up*] your heart and the hearts of your offspring—to love your God יהוה with all your heart and soul, in order that you may live. (Source: Sefaria.org) *open up Others: "circumcise."

Literally, our hearts can be circumcised, their pure natures revealed, as nowunnecessary coverings are removed.

This New Year, 5783, may we allow Hashem to remove the barriers to holiness that give us the illusion of safety. Let us allow the love in our hearts to connect us to each other, for help and support. The word "courage" is derived from the French "coeur"/"heart." Let us continue to grow our power and our bravery through what the Talmud refers to as "the highest form of wisdom" – kindness – beginning with ourselves and radiating outward to all we meet.

With the High Holidays on our doorstep, I'd like to share a few thoughts with you. When I joined this shul over a decade ago, I was amazed at how such a small synagogue survived. I grew up as one of some 3000 members (by my best recollection) of Commack Jewish Center. That institution, sadly, is now defunct.

But Commack Jewish Center had a whole huge staff - office workers, secretaries, custodians - you name it. Perhaps that overhead is why it could not sustain itself.

We do not have the same situation.

Jewish Center of the Moriches has us. You. Me.

We make it happen, or it doesn't happen; you and I are why JCM is still here - any and all of us are its staff and its caretakers.

My appeal to you, which extends not only from me but also from the rest of the board and involved membership, is that whatever your talents, your time constraints, your comforts – join us, and help us in any way you can. Your contribution of time and participation is critical, as we do not have resources to hire administrative staff.

We essentially operate on an austerity budget. We intentionally keep our dues low, and we have repairs, bills, and clergy and teaching employees just like any other religious organization. Our financial support is from your donations and dues.

We probably have some of the lowest membership dues of any synagogue in the area, and we try to be accessible to all people (members or not), irrespective of their financial situation.

I know the following words sound clichéd, but, truly, we can't keep JCM going without **YOU.**





Volunteer Opportunities at JCM

An * means that JCM is currently looking for volunteers to help with these tasks.

*Hebrew School

Coordinate with teachers and parents to make sure Hebrew School runs smoothly.

*Cemetery Committee

The JCM owns cemetery plots in Mt Pleasant Cemetery. These plots are for sale and occasionally someone contacts us to sell back their plot. Selling back plots involves the owner mailing the deed back, and coordinating with JCM's treasurer to send a check to the plot seller. Buying or selling back plots are fairly rare occurrences; usually this comes up once a year.

*Newsletter Team

Create the "Shofar Newsletter", email it to the printer, pick it up from the printer, mail it. Newsletter format mostly stays the same with each issue. JCM is currently producing four newsletters per year, with one person acting as "editor" (collecting and/or writing newsletter content), another person doing graphic design, and a third person picking up the printed newsletter from the photocopy shop and mailing the newsletters.

*Membership Liaison

Talk to prospective members when they contact the Jewish Center with questions: explain our programs, services, Hebrew School, and member pricing. This person is the "welcoming contact" that interacts with prospective members.

*Ritual Committee

Works with the Spiritual Leader to integrate traditional Jewish practices, guidelines, and prayers into Shabbat and festival services, life cycle events, and other JCM activities. Endeavors to make JCM's religious atmosphere welcoming, inclusive, and accessible.

Sunshine Committee

Contacts sick/hospitalized members and sends condolences on behalf of the JCM community.

*Phone "Keep in Touch" Committee

JCM is looking for a few additional people to join Judy Hean and Cantor Katchko in making "keep in touch" phone calls to community members. Each committee member will be given a list of people to contact on an occasional basis.

Volunteer Opportunities at JCM

*Building and Grounds Committee

When there is an issue at the JCM that needs fixing, such as the heat or electric, the Building and Ground committee arranges the repair.

The sanctuary committee deal with any issues that are in the actual sanctuary, such as upkeep, renovations, new chairs, etc.

*Correspondence Committee

Responds to mail, sends thank you cards for donations.

*Website

Manages the JCM website.

*General Board Members

Attend monthly board meetings (currently being held via Zoom); participate in guiding policy and making decisions about synagogue operations.
